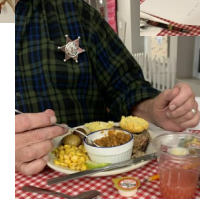
Ontario SPCA—November 18

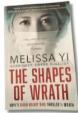

Amor Towles (2011, 311 pages)

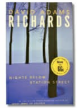
A nostalgic journey into the New York of the late 1930s at the end of the Depression.

The author's true story of being the first woman Cross Canada Marathoner to successfully run from the Atlantic to the Pacific.



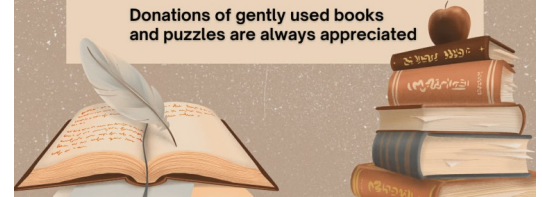

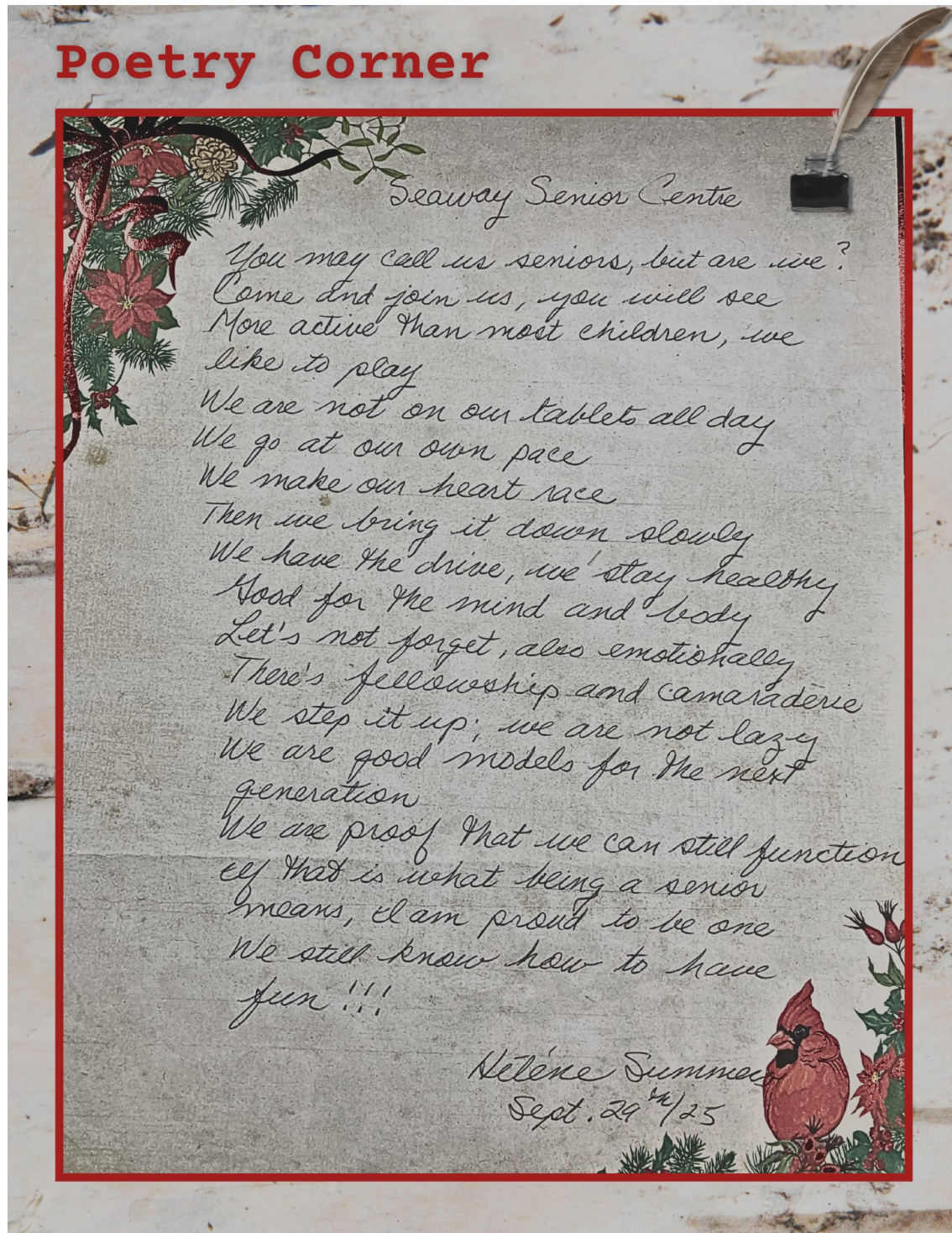

Recipe

Are you not a fan of fruitcake?

Cherry Cake is a Christmas tradition in many households, including Canadian singing icon Anne Murray. This family recipe from her Facebook page is a real star!





ANNE MURRAY

"MOM'S CHERRY CAKE"

Ingredients



1½ cups (375 mL) butter
2 cups (500 mL) granulated sugar
4 eggs
1 tsp (5 mL) each: vanilla extract, almond extract, lemon extract
4 cups (1 L) all-purpose flour, divided
2 tsp (10 mL) baking powder
1 tsp (5 mL) salt
1 cup (250 mL) milk
1½ cups (375 mL) red candied cherries, halved
1½ cups (375 mL) green candied cherries, halved

Instructions

1. With electric mixer, cream butter with sugar thoroughly.
2. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each. Beat in extracts.
3. Combine 3½ cups (875 mL) of flour with baking powder and salt; mix thoroughly.
4. Add flour mixture to creamed mixture alternately with milk.
5. Toss cherries with remaining ½ cup (125 mL) flour; fold into batter.
6. Pour into well-greased and floured 10-inch (3 L) Bundt pan.
7. Bake in 325° F (160° C) oven for 1¾ hours or until tester inserted in center comes out clean.
8. Let cool a few minutes in pan, then turn out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

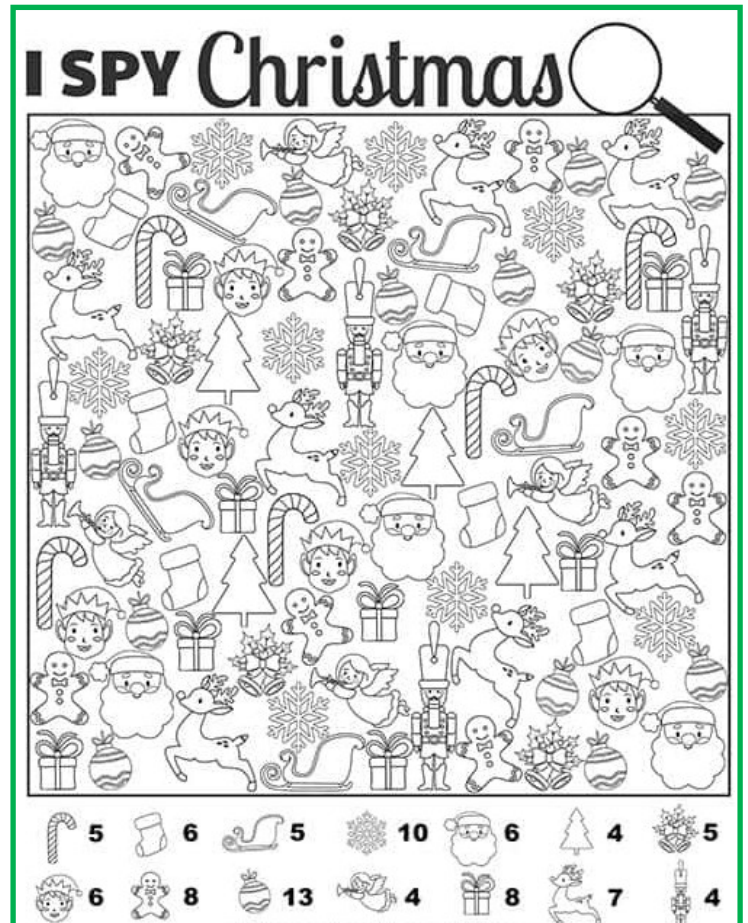
